

## Rosy Shells: Hat & Scarf Set



I call this "Rosy Shells" simply because that's what the color of the yarn reminded me of: roses. But it could easily be Purpley Shells or Bluey Shells or Greeny Shells... or a combination of colors! Be creative, and go with the flow!

### Sizes and Materials List ...

<b>Size:</b>	Adult (one size will fit most)
<b>Hook(s):</b>	US F/5 (3.75 mm)US G/6 (4.0 mm) or size needed to obtain gauge.
<b>Yarn:</b>	DK weight yarn. Sample uses Woolcraft's New Fashion DK
<b>Colors &amp; Approx. Yardage:</b>	Your choice of color, approx 766 yds or just over 2 100g balls
<b>Notions:</b>	Yarn Needle
<b>Gauge:</b>	3 1/2 shell repeats X 9 rows = 4" <i>Always take time to check your gauge</i>


Single Crochet (sc)

## Instructions ...

### The Hat



#### Round 1

Start with a [magic ring](#). Ch 2, 9 hdc in ring, pull tail to close ring. Join with a sl st in top of ch 2.

(Alternatively, you could start with a ch 3 and join with a sl st instead of using the magic ring.)

#### Round 2

Ch 2 (beg hdc here and throughout), hdc in same st, 2 hdc in each st around, join in top of beg hdc (20 sts)

#### Round 3

Ch 2, 2 hdc in next st, \*hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st,\* rep from \* to \* around, join in top of beg hdc. (30 sts)

#### Round 4

Ch 2, hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st, \*hdc in next 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st,\* rep from \* to \* around, join in top of beg hdc. (40 sts)

#### Round 5

Ch 2, hdc in next 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st, \*hdc in next 3 sts, 2 hdc in next st,\* rep from \* to \* around, join in top of beg hdc. (50 sts)

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Round 6	Ch 2, hdc in next 3 sts, 2 hdc in next st, *hdc in next 4 sts, 2 hdc in next st*; repeat from * to * around, join in top of beg hdc. (60 sts)
Round 7	Ch 2, hdc in next 4 sts, 2 hdc in next st, *hdc in next 5 sts, 2 hdc in next st,* rep from * to * around, join in top of beg hdc. (70 sts)
Round 8	Ch 2, hdc in next 5 sts, 2 hdc in next st, *hdc in next 6 sts, hdc in next st,* rep from * to * 7 times, hdc in each remaining st, join in top of beg hdc. (79 sts)  (To put it another way, in round 8 you're increasing as with every preceding row, but you're going to <b>SKIP</b> the <b>LAST TWO</b> increases.)
Round 9	Ch 1, sc in same st (ch 1 <b>will not</b> count as a stitch in this row), sk 2 sts, 5 dc in next st (shell made), sk 2 sts, *sc in next st, sk 2 sts, 5 dc in next st, sk 2 sts,* rep from * to * around. Join with a sl st to first sc. (78 sts)
Round 10	Ch 3, 2 dc in same st, sc into 3rd dc of shell below, *5 dc in sc of previous round, sc into 3rd dc of shell below,* rep from * to * around ending with 2 dc in same st as beg hdc. (79 sts)
Round 11	Repeat round 9. (78 sts)
Round 12	Repeat round 10. (79 sts)
Round 13	Repeat round 9. (78 sts)
Round 14	Repeat round 10. (79 sts)
Round 15	Repeat round 9. (78 sts)
Round 16	Repeat round 10. (79 sts)
Round 17	Repeat round 9. (78 sts)
Round 18	Repeat round 10. (79 sts)
Round 19	Repeat round 9. (78 sts)
Round 20	Repeat round 10. (79 sts)
Round 21	Repeat round 9. (78 sts)

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Finishing ...

Fasten off, weave in ends

The Scarf - End 1



The scarf is made starting from the middle, working to one end, fastening off and going back to the middle to start the other half. This way both ends look even, instead of having one straight edge and one wavy one.



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Base Chain	Ch 26.
Row 1	Sc in second ch from hook, *sk 2 ch, 5 dc in next st (shell made), sk 2 ch, sc in next ch,* rep from * to * to the end. (25 sts)
Row 2	Ch 3 (beg dc), turn, dc in sc of previous row, sc in 3rd dc of shell below, *5 dc in next sc of previous row, sc in 3rd dc of shell below,* rep from * to * to end, ending row with 3 dc in last st. (24 sts)
Row 3	Ch 1, turn, sc in 2nd ch from hook, *sk 2 ch, 5 dc in next st (shell made), sk 2 ch, sc in next ch,* rep from * to * to the end (ending with a sc in top of beg dc. (25 sts)
Row 4	Repeat row 2.
Row 5	Repeat row 1.
Row 6	Repeat row 2.
Rows 7-75	Alternate repeats of rows 1 and 2, ending with a row 1 repeat.

### Finishing ...

Fasten off, weave in ends

### The Scarf - End 2

Attach yarn with a single crochet to the end of row 1 (attach slip knot to hook, insert hook in stitch. Pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through both loops on hook.)

Row 1	*Sk 2 ch, 5 dc in next st (shell made), sk 2 ch, sc in next ch,* rep from * to * to the end. (25 sts)
Row 2	Ch 3 (beg dc), turn, dc in sc of previous row, sc in 3rd dc of shell below, *5 dc in next sc of previous row, sc in 3rd dc of shell below,* rep from * to * to end, ending row with 3 dc in last st. (24 sts)
Row 3	Ch 1, turn, sc in 2nd ch from hook, *sk 2 ch, 5 dc in next st (shell made), sk 2 ch, sc in next ch,* rep from * to * to the end (ending with a sc in top of beg dc). (25 sts)
Row 4	Repeat row 2.
Row 5	Repeat row 3.
Row 6	Repeat row 2.


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Rows 7-75

Alternate repeats of rows 2 and 3, ending with a row 3 repeat.

### Finishing ...

Fasten off, weave in ends



Now you have a choice to make. Do you want your scarf to look more defined, or do you like that rippy wavy look it's got? Because you can go either way. Personally, I like the rippy wavy look, so I've left it as is. But if you block it, you'll get a little more definition to the shells. It's all up to you and what you want the finished product to look like. Creativity is part of the fun!!

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
